

MINOR IN CREATIVE WRITING

Overview

Students studying Creative Writing engage closely with their professors and collaboratively with each other in our limited-enrollment, workshop-style courses, receiving detailed feedback on their original stories, poems, and essays.

Students also read a diverse array of contemporary fiction, poetry, and nonfiction, and are encouraged to explore multilingual writing in our courses, whether by incorporating languages other than English into their work or by deploying dialects and vernaculars from communities and geographic regions across the English-speaking world.

* Students may declare a Minor in Creative Writing through their school or college. Submitting materials to the Creative Writing Program is not required for the minor.

*** A minimum grade of C- or better is required in each course and with an overall GPA in the minor of 2.0 or better.

**** Students pursuing both a major and a minor (or two majors) offered by the Department of English may double-count a maximum of two English courses toward the fulfillment of their degree requirements. They must also have an additional major or minor in a department other than English.
